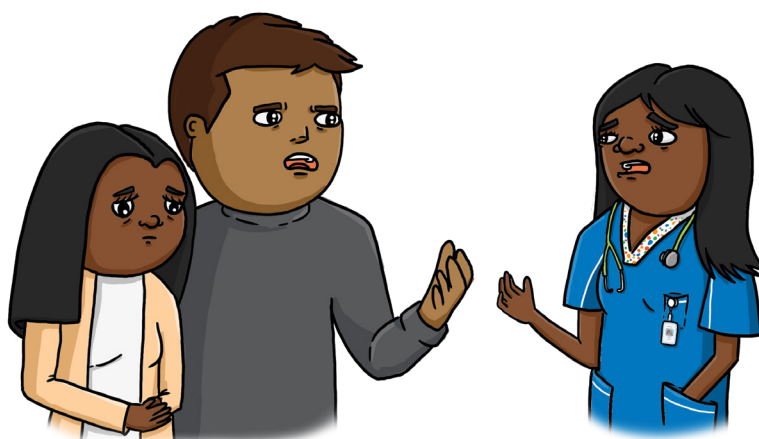

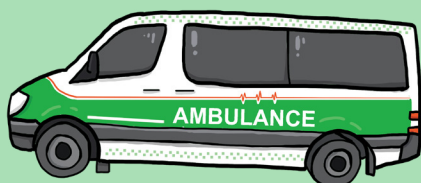

When to call the hospital



Trust yourself, you know bub the best and there are no silly questions.

If it's an **emergency** please call **000** or go to the **Emergency Department** straight away.



If you are worried about bub and unsure what to do call **0410 717 816**. The nurse will give you advice and ask you to come to PCH Emergency Department or make an outpatient clinic appointment.



Please call if bub:

Has a fever of 38 degrees or over. Bacterial infection can be life threatening if not treated.

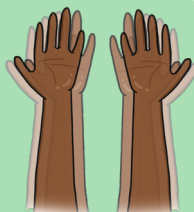


Paracetamol should only be given if bub is in pain or if the doctor tells you to give it to them. Please phone and check with the nurse or doctor on **0410 717 816**.



Chills or shivering.

Has headaches, blurred or double vision.



Has bruising, ongoing bleeding of gums, nose or any other worrying symptoms.



Having trouble pooping for more than 2 days.



Pain that is not going away.



Is vomiting or diarrhoea that's not going away or slowing down.



Has been around someone with chicken pox, measles or shingles or a doctor has said they have an infectious disease.

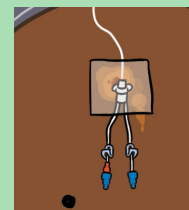
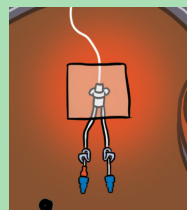


Is being quiet, not their normal self or is sleepy.



Needs to see a GP or health clinic for any reason while on treatment.

Central line is red, oozing, the dressing has moved position or is lifting.



Do not give bub any aspirin or anti-inflammatory like Nurofen® when having chemotherapy.
