Government Funded Therapy Services

- National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS)
 - Under 9 years: Wanslea 1300 969 645

 Wanslea coordinates free Early Childhood Approach (ECA) services for children under 9 years with developmental delay or disability on behalf of the NDIS. You will need to to register for the service you can contact Wanslea if you need someone to help you.
 - Over 9 years: NDIS 1800 800 110 ndis.gov.au/understanding

Children with a diagnosed disability may be able to receive free intervention services through the NDIS. You will need to register for the service – you can contact your Local Area Coordinator (Advanced Personnel Management 1800 276 522 or Mission Australia 1800 370 776) if you need someone to help you.

Private Therapy Services

Talk to your family doctor to see if your child is eligible and to arrange appropriate referrals.
- Medicare's Mental Health Care Plan 13 20 11 <u>servicesaustralia.gov.au/mental-health-care-and-medicare</u>
 Program provides rebates for appointments with a psychologist or appropriately trained occupational therapist or social worker for mental health problems. Talk to your family doctor to see if your child is eligible, and to arrange a referral.

Carer Support

 You may be eligible for the Carer Allowance, an income-tested government payment for people who provide daily care to a person with extra needs.

 Carers WA provides support to parents of autistic children. This service includes free and low-cost counselling services, education and advice to help parents build resilience and coping skills.

 Kiind provides free support to families of children living with a disability and/or developmental delay, including emotional support and help with finding appropriate services and resources.

Child care and education support

- Child care may be able to arrange extra support for your child. Let your child care staff know that your child has an austism diagnosis and ask if any help is available. The child care will need a letter and the Autism Assessment Report to apply for assistance.
- School Supports some children benefit from assistance at school to participate in classroom activities and enhance learning. Let your child's school staff know that your child has an autism diagnosis and ask if any help is available. Your child's school will need a letter and/or the Autism Assessment Report to apply for assistance.
